## A FEW INSTRUCTIONS

#### For your safety:

- Choose your route according to your physical condition and our technical level.
- Inform those around you of your itinerary.
- Wear a helmet (compulsory for children up to the age of 12).
- Make sure you have everything you need for repairs: a first-aid kit and supplies.

### **Specific recommendations**

Hunting is a major activity from mid-September to mid-January. During this period:

 Wear brightly coloured clothing, identify yourself and respect the signs posted by hunters.

## Respecting the environment

- Use the marked paths, do not ride offroad.
- Do not cut the switchbacks when descending.
- Follow the direction of the routes.
- Don't brake too hard, as locking the rear wheel will cause the paths and tracks to overgrow rapidly.
- Respect private property and crops.
- Close gates.
- · Watch out for farm and forestry machinery.
- Avoid picking flowers, fruit and mushrooms in the wild.
- Do not disturb the peace and quiet of residents or animals.
- · Keep your rubbish to yourself.
- Be discreet and do not shout unnecessarily.
- Do not light fires.



Please note! Pedestrians have priority on footpaths. Stop when crossing them and be aware that you could be held responsible in the event of a collision. Note the international emergency number: 112.










## Balcon du Giffre Samoëns Taninges







On this family-friendly itinerary, discover the Giffre valley and its charming villages.


Take the D907 towards Taninges, then branch off onto the D902 towards Châtillon-sur-Cluses.

Pass through the villages of La Rivière-Enverse and Morillon before reaching Samoëns on the D4.



## Cirque du Fer-à-Cheval







From our charming village of Samoëns, set off to discover our magnificent valley. On the way to the Cirque du Ferà-Cheval, stop to admire the spectacular Gorges des Tines, then explore the authentic village of Sixt-Fer-à-Cheval. Finally, you'll reach the largest mountain cirque in the Alps: the majestic Fer-à-Cheval.

Practical information: The Cirque du Fer-à-Cheval is a nature reserve. Cycling is prohibited on the path leading to the Fond de la Combe from 10am to 6pm from 1 July to 31 August, as well as at weekends in June and September.



## Boucle du Giffre Samoëns Mieussy








From Samoëns, take the D907 towards Mieussy, passing through Taninges. At Mieussy, continue on the D926 towards Marignier, then follow the D6, Route de Châtillon.

Once you reach the village of Châtillon-sur-Cluses, head down into the Giffre valley on the D902. Leave this road to follow the signs for La Rivière-Enverse, then cross Morillon before reaching Samoëns on the D4.



## Col de Joux Plane







The Col de Joux Plane is a legendary challenge, climbed 11 times by the Tour de France. It offers exceptional views over the Giffre valley and the Mont-Blanc massif.


From Samoëns, take the road towards the hamlet of Chantemerle. Continue up to the Col de Joux Plane, where you'll discover a charming little lake nestling at the summit.

For the descent, at the Mévoutier crossroads, head towards Mathonex, then on to the Bérouze chapel in Samoëns.



## Col de La Ramaz








The Col de la Ramaz links the Sommand plateau to the Praz de Lys plateau. It was climbed during the 14e stage of the 2023 Tour de France, which linked Annemasse to Morzine. This pass offers breathtaking views of the Mont Blanc range.

Take the D907 towards Mieussy, passing through Taninges. At Mieussy, follow the signs for Praz de Lys-Sommand via the D308. Head back down towards Taninges, then continue through La Rivière-Enverse and Morillon before reaching Samoëns on the D4.



## Boucle des Esserts







Enjoy breathtaking views of the northern slopes of the Giffre valley from Les Esserts, in the heart of the Morillon resort.


Take the D907 to Morillon, then start your ascent along the Route des Esserts (D54).

Then head back down towards L'Etelley on the route du Mas Devant, and continue on the D907 towards Samoëns.



## Plateau des Saix







The Plateau des Saix marks the start of our ski resort in winter and the downhill mountain biking area in summer. Samoëns 1600 is also the departure point for paragliders.

From the tourist office, take the Avenue du Giffre, cross the bridge and head up towards the Hameau de Vercland. Continue on to the Plateau des Saix.





The Critérium du Dauphiné is a prestigious cycle race held every year in France.

Some of its iconic stages take place on the Plateau des Saix and the Col de Joux Plane. This event is of particular importance to professional riders, as it is often ideal preparation for the Tour de France.





The Tour de France is one of the most popular sporting events, attracting thousands of spectators every year. Samoëns was lucky enough to welcome the Tour on Saturday 15 July 2023, during the 14<sup>e</sup> stage. This stage started in Annemasse and finished in Morzine, passing through Samoëns and the ascent of the famous Col de Joux Plane.



The women's Tour de France is back for another exciting edition, crossing France from west to east, between Brittany and the Alps. See you on Sunday 3 August in Samoëns!





If you're a cyclist, hiker, roller skier or other non-motorised enthusiast, the Adopte un Col! event is for you. For one day, the road over a legendary Alpine pass is closed to motorised traffic. It's a day dedicated to soft mobility.






#### Le tour des Vallons







Enjoy a pleasant family walk to discover the hamlet of Les Vallons in Samoëns and follow the banks of the River Giffre.


From the Samoëns tourist office, head towards Sixt Fer à Cheval. A few metres after the second roundabout, turn right onto the small road that runs alongside the dairy. Then turn right onto the wide track that leads to a footbridge over the Clévieux torrent. Turn left and follow the path traced over the old dykes of the Giffre to the vast plain of Les Vallons.



## La Kids Ludique









From the Tourist Office, follow the banks of the Clévieux and walk along the Giffre towards Morillon, passing under the Grand Massif Express ski lift.


Don't miss the Lac aux Dames leisure centre. Return via the route des Drugères, in front of the ice rink.



## La boucle du Giffre : Samoëns - Morillon









A family-friendly route to discover the magnificent Giffre valley. From Samoëns, follow the Giffre towards Morillon. Through the undergrowth, cross our footbridges and admire our two emblematic peaks: the Pic du Marcelly and the Criou.




## Le balcon du Giffre : Samoëns - Taninges












Discover the Giffre valley as you pass through our charming villages. From Samoëns, follow the river to Taninges, then cross the commune of Châtillon-sur-Cluses to join the path leading to the river Enverse.

End your journey at the village of Morillon and return along the Giffre to Samoëns.



## La Cascade du Rouget






From the Tourist Office, take the Grand Massif road and follow the Giffre to the Gorges de Tines, passing through the hamlet of Le Perret. Continue up to the Cascade du Rouget on the GR5. Return via Ferme des Tines and the hamlets of Les Vallons.

Nicknamed 'The Queen of the Alps', the Cascade du Rouget is the most prestigious of the Sixt-Fer-à-Cheval waterfalls. Made up of two jumps, it drops more than eighty metres.



## La boucle des Allamands







From Samoëns, head towards Lac des Vernays via Verchaix. Then head along Lac Bleu de Morillon before returning to Samoëns and beginning the ascent to the hamlet of Les Allamands.


The chapel of Les Allamands, built in the 19th century by the inhabitants of the hamlet of the same name, is the most recent of the nine chapels in the hamlets of Samoëns.





## Les chapelles de Samoëns





Discover the chapels of Samoëns and the heritage of the Septimont area. The bulbous bell towers, with their Baroque influence, stand out at the bend in the road and are a reminder of the work of craftsmen in days gone by. These chapels also bear witness to the human history of Savoie.

From the Samoëns tourist office, explore the hamlets of L'Etellay, Vercland, Les Vallons, Chantemerle, Mathonex and Le Bérouze.



## Cirque du fer à Cheval











Discover the Cirque du Fer-à-Cheval and the nature reserve on this itinerary along the Giffre.

On the way to the Cirque du Fer-à-Cheval, take a break to admire the Gorges des Tines, then explore the village of Sixt-Fer-à-Cheval. You'll finally arrive at the largest mountain cirque in the Alps: the Fer-à-Cheval.


Practical information: The Cirque du Fer-à-Cheval is a nature reserve. Cycling is prohibited (on the path leading to Fond de la Combe) from 10am to 6pm from 1 July to 31 August, as well as at weekends in June and September.





## Chalet du Trot






Discover our iconic mountain: the Criou.

From the tourist office, follow the Giffre to the hamlet of Vallons d'en Haut. Cross the hamlet of Le Mont to reach the Chalet du Trot, where you can see Mont Blanc and the Pointe de Sales. Descend via Bouttiay and Vallon d'en Bas.



## Balcon de Sixt







Follow the Giffre to discover Sixt-Fer-à-Cheval.

From the tourist office, walk along the Giffre towards the village of Sixt-Fer-à-Cheval. Cross the road and head towards the hamlet of Le Mont. Head towards Le Crot, the path overlooking the village of Sixt-Fer-à-Cheval.

Cross the Giffre again and continue along its left bank as far as the village of Sixt. Return to Samoëns via the hamlets of Les Vallons.





## Lac de Gers







Discover our mountain lake: Lac de Gers.

Cross the Giffre and follow the signs for Vercland, passing the Cascade de Nant d'An. Continue up to Lac de Gers.




## Refuge de Bostan



## Refuge de Bostan






From the Samoëns tourist office, walk along the Clévieux river towards Les Fontaines. Continue as far as the hamlet of Les Allamands. The 4x4 track begins and climbs steadily through the forest, which you leave shortly before arriving at the Bostan mountain chalets.

The view opens out onto a splendid valley, dotted with boulders and lapiaz, bordered on the right by the Dents d'Oddaz. The path continues and soon leads to the refuge, a solid building on the edge of the pastures and lapiaz.



## Le Grand Crêt





From the Samoëns tourist office, cross the Giffre bridge and follow the signs for Vercland, passing under the Grand Massif Express cable car. Continue around the Vercland cable car, then take the 4x4 track on your left, heading for the Chalet du Grand Crêt.



## La Bourgeoise - Plateau des Saix









Take the Grand Massif Express ski lift up to the Plateau des Saix. Then start the descent towards the village of Samoëns via the Chalet du Crêt. From the hamlet of Chantemerle, climb La Bourgesoise.

Enjoy spectacular views over the Giffre valley and Mont Blanc.


The descent is via Verchaix, Morillon and then the banks of the Giffre.

Practical info: The Grand Massif Express ski lift is open from early June to late August.



## All Mountain





Take the Grand Massif Express and Chariande Express lifts up to the Tête des Saix, the highest point in the Samoëns ski area. From the plateau d'Agy, after passing Flaine and Les Carroz, there is an exceptional panoramic view over the Giffre and Arve valleys. Return to the village of Samoëns via Morillon and the banks of the Giffre.

**Practical info:** The Grand Massif Express chairlift is open from early June to late August. The Chariande Express chairlift is open in July and August.






From the Plateau des Saix, follow the signs for the Dian Dian trail, which takes you through mountain pastures and wooded areas to the village of Samoëns.
